## FATHER KEVIN FIRTH

Father Kevin Firth - It is with regret that we write to advise that Father Kevin is to retire this summer as Parish Priest at St Joseph's (with St Patrick's, Earby), Barnoldswick and as a valued member of the school's Governing Body, as RE Governor. Father Kevin will have celebrated 46 years in the priesthood having been ordained at St William's in Bradford in July 1977 and then went on to serve parishes across Yorkshire and Aberdeenshire before returning to Yorkshire until arriving in St Joseph's with St Patrick's in 2015.

The whole school, like the parish, will miss his spiritual guidance, dedication and patience as well as his caring nature, allied to a great sense of humour that helps makes him and the good news of a living God so relatable. Father Kevin will be leaving the parish on 30 August and will be replaced by the new parish priest, Father Phillip Hall.




## WINMARLEIGH

In recent weeks we have taken part in a few events and have had a number of visiting coaches delivering specialist sports to our children.

We have enjoyed on site coaching by cricket coach, gymnastics coach, rugby coach, and an outdoor session of dance/fight moves to music - thoroughly enjoyed by the children with heart beats raised shown by rosy, smiling faces! We also enjoyed Taekwonda sessions for key stage 2 children.

Class 5 entered a virtual gymnastics competition following a number of coaching sessions. They received gold medals for vault and group balance and a silver medal for floor work.

A team of 11 children played and won the rugby tournament that concluded the coaching sessions that had taken part at school.

Following the successful loan of table tennis equipment and our subsequent purchase of our own equipment a group of 4 children went along to an inter-event.

# SCHOOL GOVERNORS

Schools governing bodies work together with the headteacher, the local authority and for our school, the bishop, to plan the strategic direction of the school, help oversee spending and support the headteacher, while acting as a critical friend. School governors are local volunteers, aged 18 or over, who play a vital role in helping the school give our children the best possible academic, physical, spiritual, moral and social development. In our school, we have:

- Local Authority (Lancashire County Council) Governors - appointed or nominated by the local authority;
- Parent Governors - including carers, of school pupils - elected by other parents if multiple candidates;
- Staff Governors - teaching or support staff employed at the school and elected by their colleagues; and
- Foundation Governors - appointed by the Bishop of Leeds, the Right Reverend Marcus Stock, to work with the headteacher and other governors to develop the quality of education, as well as preserving and developing St Joseph's Catholic character as a school).

You don't need any formal qualifications to be a governor, you'll get full training and support, to make sure you are fully equipped to carry out the role successfully. What you need is:

- A willingness to bring in your experience or skills to put something into your local community and help make a positive difference to the education of our children;
- An ability to represent the school community, get on with other people and work as part of a team;
- Are ready to learn and be open to new ideas; and
- Have some time to spare to attend meetings and to read necessary papers.

Key to the work of School Governors work, in the best interest of your children, is the interaction with school, family, home and Church.
